Walker, Harney Named 2025 Convention Reps

We are delighted to give a warm Wisconsin welcome to our National Representatives to the 2025 State Convention. Visiting on behalf of VFW C-in-C Al Lipphardt is Brian Walker, Assistant Adjutant General. VFW Auxiliary National Chaplain Kim Harney will represent our National President Brenda Bryant. The annual assemblage is slated for June 11–14, 2025, at the Madison Marriott West in Middleton.

Brian Walker was appointed Assistant Adjutant General of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States on Sept. 1, 2022. Serving in the U.S. Air Force from 2003 to 2015, he earned his VFW eligibility in support of the Global War on Terrorism, receiving the Air Force Expeditionary Ribbon with gold border.

Joining the VFW in 2010 at Post 4313 in Cordova, Tennessee, Brian now maintains his Gold Legacy Life Membership at Post 5066 in Collierville, Tennessee. His service in elected and appointed positions at all levels culminated with his election as the Department of Tennessee Commander in 2021, achieving All-American Commander status. On the National

A Life Member of James R. "Bob" Currieo Auxiliary 9972, she has served the organization in many capacities at all levels. Kim joined the Auxiliary as a Junior Girl at age 16, on the eligibility of her father, Allen Kent, who served in the U.S. Marine Corps in Vietnam in 1967-68, and 1975.

Aretired Special Education Teacher, Kim holds a bachelor's degree from University of Florida in Gainesville and a master's degree from Valdosta State University, Valdosta, Georgia.

The Department of Wisconsin is mourning the passing of Past State Commander John T. Giese, 76, on April 7, 2025 in Elkhorn. Our 93rd State Commander served in 2014-2015, under the theme, "Working Together", alongside Auxiliary Dept. President Victoria Newbauer. The closing sentence of his first column in the July 2014 WI VFW NEWS, spoke volumes about his leadership style: "I encourage all of you to work together to make it the kind of organization people want to join, become involved in and finally, stay with us."



A proud United States Marine, John was awarded a Purple Heart for his service as a Huey Door Gunner in Vietnam. A Gold Legacy Life Member of Elkhorn Memorial VFW Post 6375, he served in a number of offices and chairmanships at all levels of the organization. Following his term as

State Commander, John was elected to represent Wisconsin on the National Council of Administration from 2015–2019. His campaign ad for that office, reflected his commitment to the position: "As your voice on our National Council, I will communicate your concerns to our leadership. I intend to bring as much knowledge back to you and pass it on so that we can all pull together and be the best we can be."

John dedicated his life after Vietnam to a life of service to others, serving the Elkhorn Police Dept. for 31 years,

Thankfully, by the time you read this, the elections will have concluded, and we can move on to our summer activities. While I know the point of this article is dated, I feel it is important enough to rehash for our new leaders at the Post level.

The VFW is a bipartisan organization, focused on ensuring our earned rights and benefits, entitled to us by Congress, are not degraded, reduced, denied, revoked or removed. Why is this important you ask?

Section 702 of our National Bylaws outlines the position the VFW has taken in regard to politics. Politics is a personal matter, and while it is important to address the issues important to you and your community, we as an organization cannot affiliate ourselves with any particular party as it may adversely impact our mission of helping Veterans. Questions are routinely asked when someone sees a Veteran wearing VFW apparel at a political rally. While we would prefer they wouldn't, nothing in the Bylaws prevents them from doing so.

However, if that individual were to engage in an interview, while wearing this apparel, and endorse a particular candidate, the general public might assume this individual is speaking on the behalf of the entire organization, and this could result is some form of disciplinary action. Should an individual engage in such an interview, they must clearly identify that they are not speaking on behalf of the VFW, only that they are expressing their personal view. In addition, the same applies for the display of political signs, flags, etc., at a Post. This is forbidden and could also result as an adverse action against the Post.

Another question that always comes up is when a candidate requests to address the members of a Post. The advice most commonly provided is this: the Post should refrain from inviting candidates to campaign at the Post, however, if a candidate asks, and the Post is inclined to have them speak, it is imperative that they invite the opposing candidates to address the members of the Post as well.

In addition, and while it may be confusing, if an incumbent would like to solicit input from the members, regarding Veteran-centric issues, or discuss Veteran Legislation they are promoting, this is acceptable, as long as they do not deviate into general political topics. Information obtained this way may support the VFW's Legislative agenda.

Finally, worry about your own political viewpoint! Refrain from discussing politics at your Post meeting. If you must talk about politics with your comrades, invite them to your house and discuss it over a beverage of your choosing, since it is best to leave politics at home!

Comrades:

By now your Post elections should be completed. Your Officers-elect are probably curious and perhaps anxious about their positions, especially if it is new to them. I'm positive that every Officer starts out with the intention of doing a fantastic job for their Post, but sometimes good intentions can get sidetracked. So, try to prepare yourselves ahead of time for the position you have been elected to for the coming year. Start by reading any manuals

available from the Department and National that explain a specific position in more detail than section 218. Many online videos are also available.

In the case of many of the Officers, reading section 218 of the Manual of Procedure will be mostly adequate to explain an Officers' duties. However, the Quartermaster's position is without a doubt the most technical to master since there are financial records to maintain, reports to file and deadlines to meet. For Quartermasters, a helpful checklist and other tools are available on the Department website – **vfwwi.org**. Log in under the **Members Only** tab and look for **Quartermaster & Trustees** in the navigation menu. Select that option and you'll find all kinds of helpful manuals and forms. The Quartermaster Checklist Guide is available there and should be your go-to document for quick help on what needs to be done and when.

There's a lot that can be learned from studying (Yes, I said study!) manuals and checklists. However, if you're new to a position, ask for help from a Post mentor. The Quartermaster job in particular will run more smoothly with some experienced help by your side.

One last comment here is important for new Quartermasters (and Trustees) – do not accept a messed up financial situation. The Post's financial accounting and reporting (taxes, ledger, audits, etc.) must be up to date, accurate and balanced against the bank when you accept the position. If something appears questionable, there are people available to help resolve problems. Hopefully, your Post Commander is experienced and if questions still persist, then the District Commander, State Inspector and HQ staff will try to assist you as needed. Don't be afraid to ask for assistance.

Best wishes to all new and recycled Post Officers this coming year!



On April 22, the Wisconsin State Capitol became a powerful symbol of unity, service, and advocacy as over 400 Veterans from across the state gathered for Veterans Day at the Capitol (VDATC) 2025. The event, held in partnership with the American Legion, Disabled American Veterans (DAV), and numerous other Veterans Service Organizations (VSOs), was a resounding success, bringing together constituents from every State Senate District and 93 of the 99 Assembly Districts.

service members. This was followed by a dynamic presentation titled "How to Communicate with Legislators" led by Joey Hoey, equipping attendees with tools to effectively advocate for Veterans' issues.

With energy and purpose, attendees marched from Monona Terrace to the State Capitol, where a powerful rally in the rotunda united Veterans, Legislators, and supporters. The program opened with a welcome by WDVA Secretary-designee James Bond, and remarks by Governor Project, shared inspiring stories and mission updates, emphasizing the importance of hon-



heard in the Legislative process.

Bipartisan support was on full display, with impactful speeches from: Rep. William Penterman (R-Hustisford); Rep. Christine Sinicki (D-Milwaukee); Sen. André Jacque (R-New Franken); Sen. Jodi Habush Sinykin (D-Whitefish Bay). Each lawmaker spoke passionately about the critical importance of the two top Veteran priorities being advanced this session:

• Reducing the eligibility requirement for the Veteran and Surviving Spouses Property accessible to more Veterans across Wisconsin. fine photos from the day!

• Securing \$500,000 in funding for the UW MIA Recovery Project, to bring home our missing in action service members and provide closure to their families.

Additionally, we will continue to follow up with lawmakers to help move these vital bills forward in the current Legislative session.

Thank you to all who made this day meaningful, and thank you to the Veterans whose service continues to inspire and shape our state's future.





There will be first, second, and third place winners in each of three categories. First place winners will have the option of submitting their entry for judging in the National Competition in Columbus, OH. The three categories are:

CATEGORY 1: Public Promotion of Poppy Campaign

- Window, booth, parade, poster displays, campaign promotion, etc.
- Displays must be designed for public exposure and must bear a message soliciting a donation for and wearing of the VFW "Buddy" Poppy.

CATEGORY 2: Memorial or Inspirational Displays

- Wreaths, memorial tablets or plaques, patriotic or devotional themes.
- Displays must be designed to honor the dead, to inspire devotion to God and Country, or to dramatize the activities supported by the "Buddy" Poppy.

CATEGORY 3: Artistic or Decorative Use of Poppies

- Post Home displays, table center-pieces, corsages, pictures, models, scenes, hats, novelty pieces, etc.
- Any display not meeting the qualifications of Category 1 or 2, shall automatically be entered in Category 3.







Wisconsin Veterans of Foreign Wars News

As Secretary, my two top priorities are advocating for programs that benefit Wisconsin's Veterans and strengthening the vital partnerships that make our work possible. That is why I am so grateful for the relationship we've built with the VFW. Together, we are stronger, and that strength is essential in protecting and supporting our most vulnerable Veterans.

Governor Evers shares this commitment to strong partnerships. That's why he has once again submitted a budget that includes funding for the expanded Veteran Outreach and Recovery Program (VORP). This innovative initiative — one of the first of its kind in the nation — demonstrates the power of collaboration in delivering life-changing services to Wisconsin Veterans.

VORP bridges the gaps that too often leave Veterans struggling alone. VORP outreach coordinators work with County and Tribal Veteran Service Officers, law enforcement, nonprofits, VSOs, and other community organizations to connect Veterans to vital resources. They help Veterans secure housing, access mental healthcare, find employment, and navigate complex systems. Importantly, they don't wait for Veterans to come to them — they meet the Veteran wherever they are, traveling across the state, building trust, and breaking down barriers.

Currently, VORP operates in 16 regions, each with a dedicated coordinator providing case management and community-based support. In addition, we have four Clinical Coordinators and two Program Supervisors who play a key role in delivering these services. However, funding from Governor Evers's ARPA allocation, which

Secretary, Wisconsin Department of Veterans Affairs



supports seven of these positions, is set to expire. We've requested general-purpose revenue to sustain these roles.

Without this critical funding, we will have to return to 11 Regions and two Clinical Coordinators. That reduction would mean longer wait times, delayed mental health assessments, and slower responses in getting Veterans into housing and treatment. Fully funding the expanded program means more lives saved and more dignity restored. It's the right thing to do to honor the promise we made to those who served.

VORP is just one way the WDVA helps Veterans overcome challenges. We believe no Veteran should have to face them alone. That's why your advocacy — and the VFW's commitment to ensuring no Veteran is left behind — matters so much.

We encourage you to contact your elected State Representatives to support programs like VORP, so Veterans know we have their backs. You can find your Legislator online at legis.wisconsin.gov.

I am grateful for the VFW's vocal support in keeping Veteran support programs fully funded and supported in the Badger State. Thank you!




THE BOOK CORNER

For the Love of a Girl

by William Hiles

Self-published in 2006 with Trafford Publishing of Bloomington, IN, "For the Love of a Girl" chronicles author Bill Herstowski's (pen name William Hiles) life growing up on the South side of Chicago in the 1950s, to his time with the U.S. Marine Corps in Vietnam, to life afterwards. Or as he put it to me in his note with the book:

"The book began as a short page to explain to my wife, kids, family and friends, my unappealing attitude towards life with rare smiles and



bad attitude. It was the war I fought in as an Ontos Platoon Radio man in 1967 and 1968. But I wanted the world to see my failures and succeeds [sic] and the quite unmatchable meeting of me and my mate on a special leave which I'll never forget, so the story began at my beginning in Chicago, IL. In the 1950s.

From that "short page" came 234 pages of quite the fascinating tale:

"It began in my sophomore year at Morton West, davs engrossed with the

assassination of JFK, my eternal vigilance, patriotism. Enlisting with our Marine Corps was my only answer, though immensely protested by the love I sacrificed and abandoned. Launched by brutal training then jungle warfare with a heavily armored tracked vehicle platoon and a radio on my back, my life disarrayed until special leave to Chicago guided me to the girl met by pure chance. Her I also left, for the finality of a 19 month tour, resuming with the Hue City offensive that shook the country and the world. But, this girl waited."



Post 1318 Celebrates a Century of Service


